

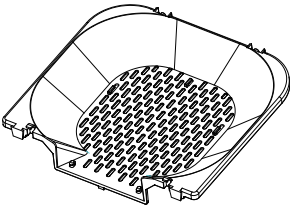
Roll-Away Nesting Box User Manual

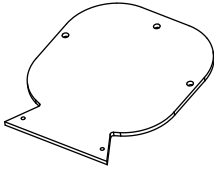
Product Introduction

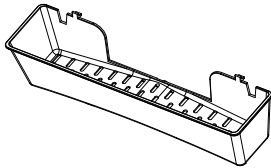

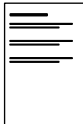

User Manual *1

This roll-away nesting box is compatible with most standard and homemade nesting boxes, as long as the internal space is larger than 14"×12"×12".

Ideal for small to medium breeds like Silkie, Amberlink, Leghorn, and Barred Rock.

The 5.5 cm egg entrance fits eggs from small to large sizes. Each egg collection box can hold 5–7 eggs.

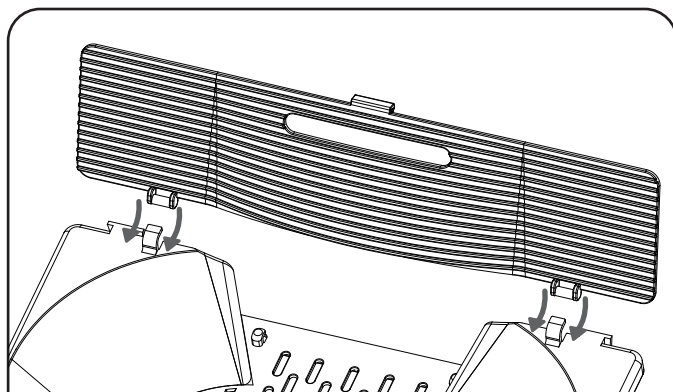
If the eggs aren't rolling smoothly, check the slope angle and adjust it for optimal performance. The slope should be gentle enough to prevent egg breakage, yet steep enough to ensure safe rolling into the collection area.

Always keep the nesting box dry. A damp environment can lead to mold and bacteria growth, affecting hen health. Regularly check the box to ensure drainage holes and egg channels are not blocked.

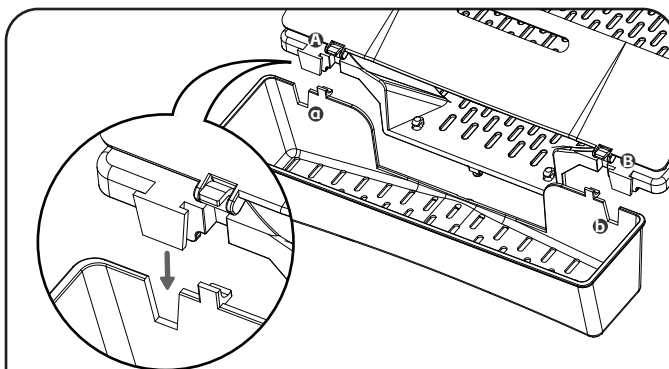
Overcrowding is a common mistake in chicken keeping. Ensure each hen has enough space to lay eggs comfortably. Generally, one nesting box should be provided for every 3-4 hens.

Ensure hens receive a balanced diet, especially calcium-rich layer feed, to promote strong eggshells. Fresh water should always be available

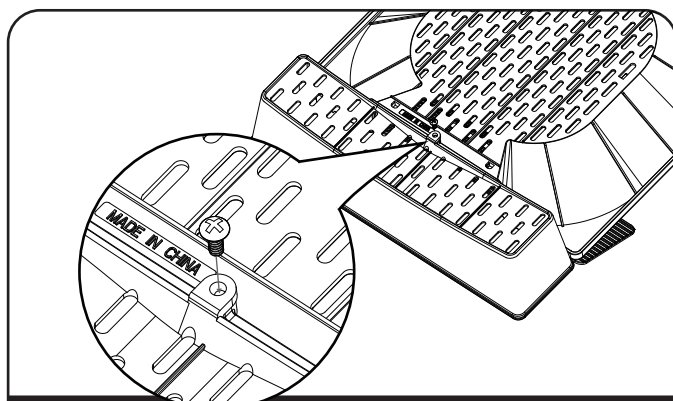
Installation & Use



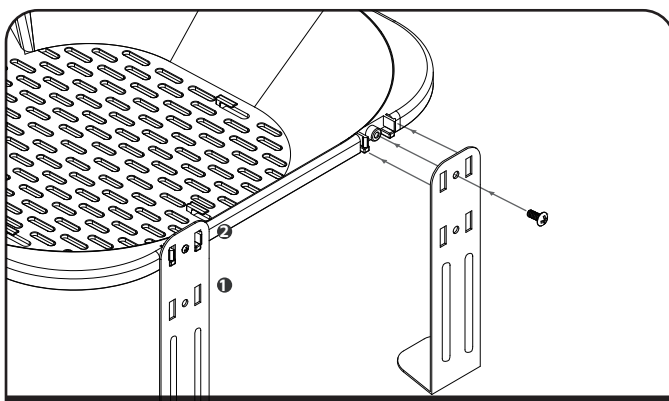
1. Insert the Lid into the corresponding position of the curved part of the Egg-laying Nest.



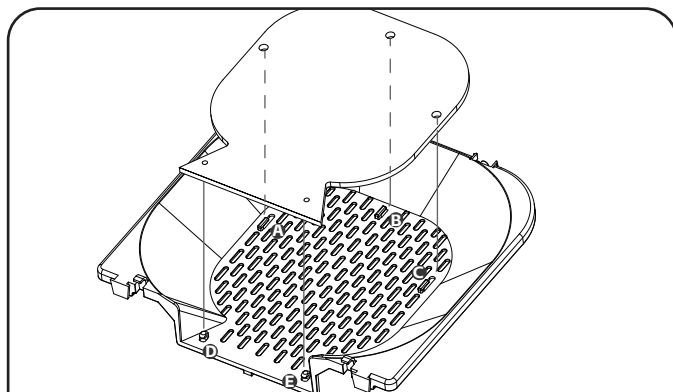
2. Insert the wedge-shaped tabs of the Egg-laying Nest into the slots of the Egg Collection Box.



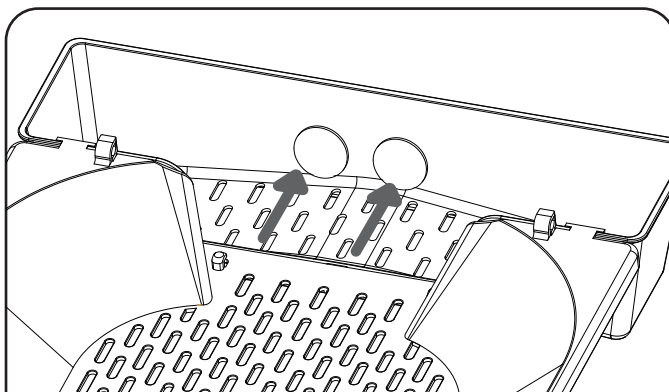
3. Secure the connection between the Egg-laying Nest and the Egg Collection Box by fastening screws from the back



4. Attach bracket to nest edge and screw in; height adjustable (1/2)



5. Align the holes on the nest pad with the marked positions A-E on the nesting box bottom, insert and secure to prevent shifting



6. Adhere EVA foam pad to collection box inner wall to protect eggs from damage

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

What should I do if my hens aren't using the nesting box?

If your hens are reluctant to use the new nesting box, try placing some fake eggs inside and securing them with double-sided tape to guide them. Hens tend to mimic the behavior of other chickens, so if one or more hens start using the box, it may encourage others to follow.

How often should I clean the nesting box?

It's generally recommended to clean the nesting box once a week, or more frequently if needed. Simply rinse it with water and ensure there is no buildup of debris.

Can I use straw or other bedding materials?

Each nesting box comes with three nesting pads. However, to enhance comfort, you may add a small amount of straw or wood shavings inside the box, as long as it does not interfere with the smooth rolling of the eggs.
