

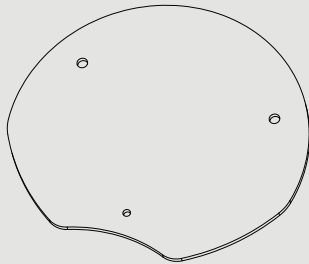

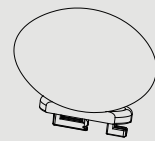
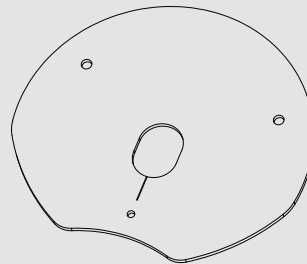
Your package includes ONE of the two pad styles. (Install according to your pad type.)

We offer two premium jute nesting pads designed to meet different preferences and needs. Both pads are made from high-quality natural jute fiber, providing excellent cushioning, breathability, and egg protection.

Pad A – Standard
(Training eggs not included)



Pad B – Deluxe with Training Egg Recess
(Training eggs included)



⚠ WARNING

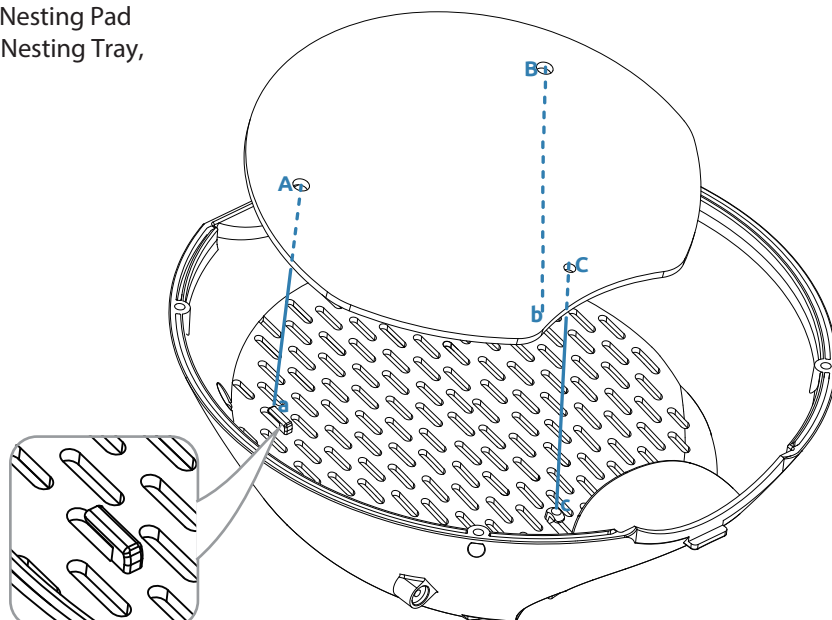
- FOR ANIMAL USE ONLY - Not for human use.
- CHOKING HAZARD - Keep Training eggs away from children and pets. Not a toy.
- SUPERVISE FIRST USE - Monitor hens during initial introduction to ensure proper use.
- FIRE HAZARD - Keep away from heat lamps, heaters, and open flames. Jute is flammable.
- INSPECT REGULARLY - Check for wear, tears, mold, or damage before each use

Pad A - Installation Diagram

- Align the A, B, and C holes on the Jute Nesting Pad with the a, b, c mounting posts on the Nesting Tray, then insert them into place.

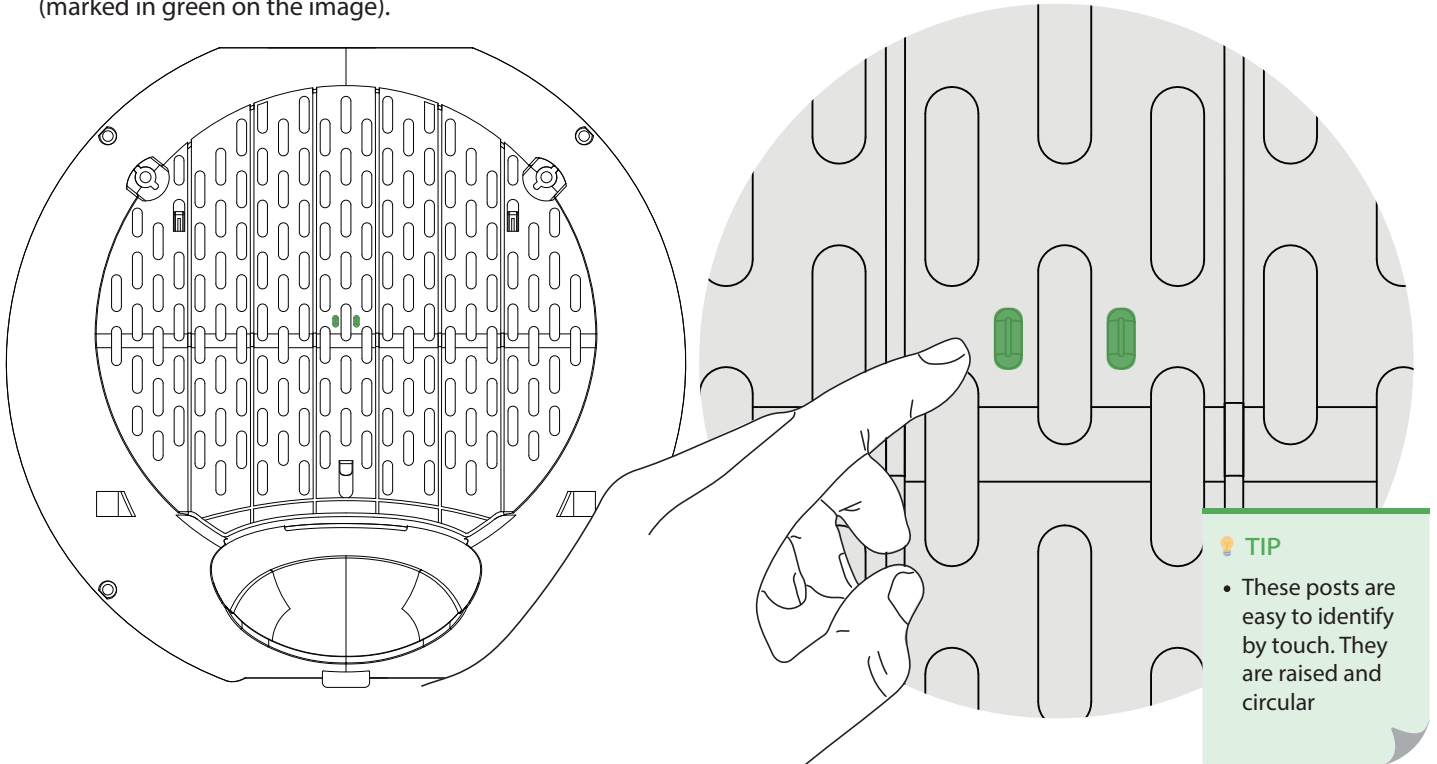


Pad B - Installation Guide

Step 1—Install the Training Egg

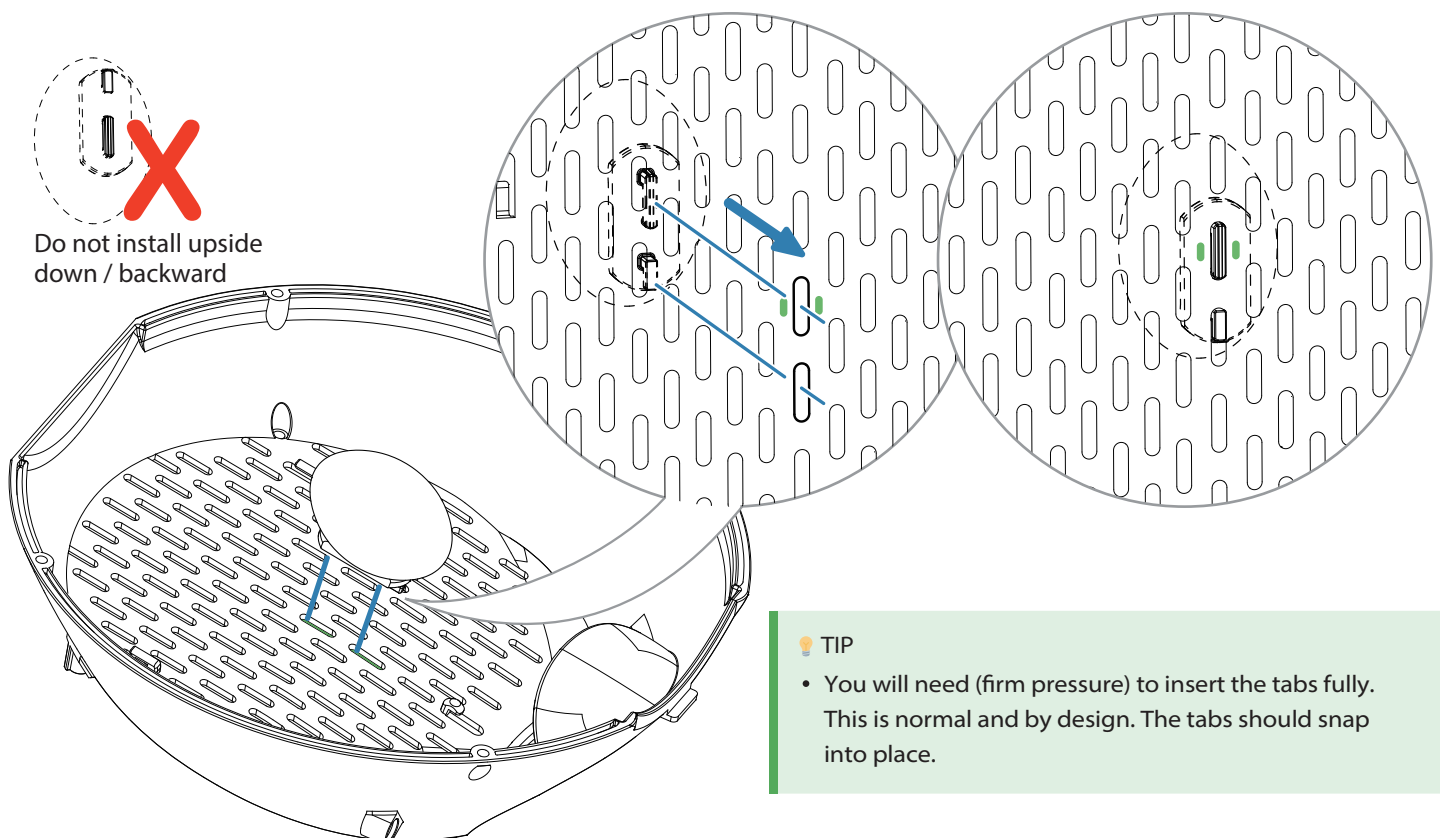
1.1 Locate the mounting posts for the Training Egg

- Turn Nesting Tray upside down. Look at the inside bottom surface. You will see two small plastic posts near the center (marked in green on the image).



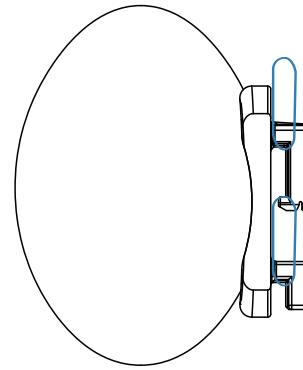
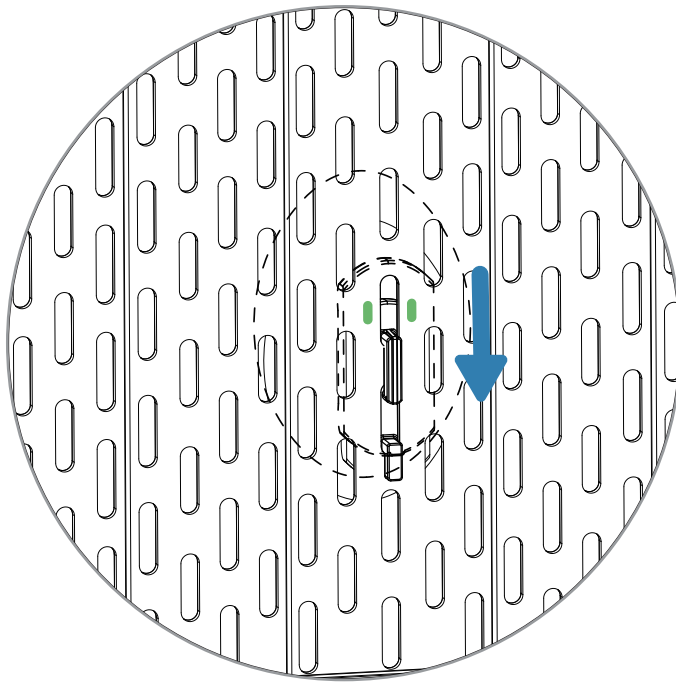
1.2 Insert the Training Egg

- Take Training Egg and check the bottom side. You will see two plastic tabs on the bottom of the egg. Align the tabs with the corresponding mounting holes in Nesting Tray (the two small plastic posts in the previous step, you can easily find the correct position by touch.). Then press the egg down into the holes until the tabs are fully inserted.



1.3 Lock the Training Egg

- ◀ Slide the Training Egg downward into the mounting hole until you hear a click. This sound indicates that the egg is firmly locked in place. Once secured, the egg should remain stable and cannot be lifted out of the mounting hole.

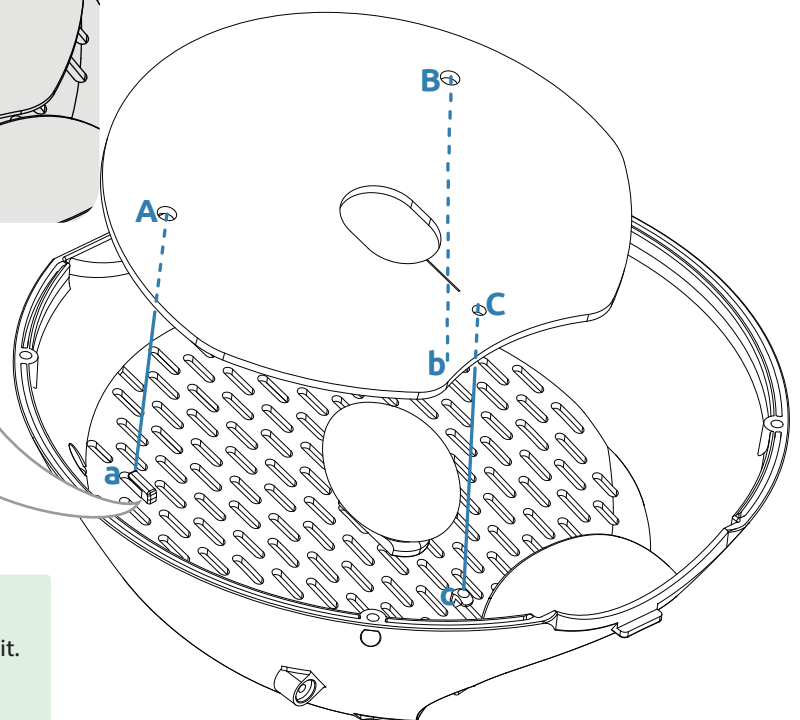
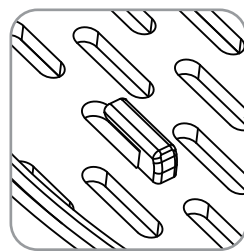
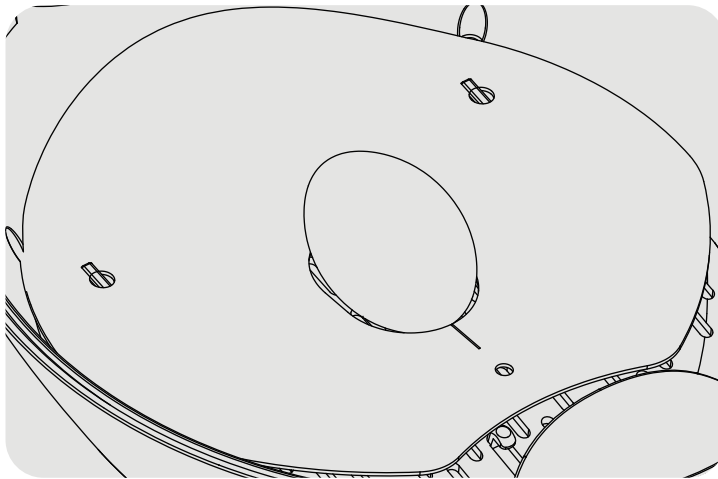


⚠ WARNING

- If the egg does not click or still lifts out, reinsert the tabs and slide again.

STEP 2—Install the Jute Nesting Pad

- Align the A, B, and C holes on the Jute Nesting Pad with the a, b, c mounting posts on the Nesting Tray, then insert them into place.



💡 TIP

- The pad should rest loosely on the posts. Do not force it. It is designed to be removable for cleaning.

Recommended Benefits

Training eggs

- Train hens to lay eggs in designated nesting boxes.
- Help new layers learn proper nesting behavior.
- Discourage and correct egg-pecking habits in hens.

Jute Nesting Pads

- Cushion eggs to prevent cracks and breakage.
- Create a soft, comfortable laying environment.
- Encourage hens to return to the same nesting spot.
- Natural material that's easy to clean and replace.

FOR OUTDOOR USE

- Place the box in a **shaded or covered area** to protect the Jute Nesting Pad from direct sunlight.
- Prolonged UV exposure may cause the pad to deteriorate faster.

CARE & MAINTENANCE

Daily Cleaning

Remove droppings and debris with a brush or scoop.

Spot clean soiled areas if needed.

Weekly Cleaning

Shake out loose debris.

Check for moisture, mold, or damage.

Replace immediately if wet or soiled.

Replacement Schedule

Replace pad immediately if you notice:

Foul odor that doesn't go away after cleaning.

Visible mold or mildew (black/green spots).

Significant wear, tears, or holes.

Heavy soiling that won't clean out.

Loss of cushioning or flattened fibers.

Pest infestation (mites, lice).

Recommended Replacement

Normal use: every 2 weeks.

High-humidity climates: every 7–10 days.

More frequently with multiple hens per box.

Nesting Pad Replacement

- Replace Jute Nesting Pads when they become heavily soiled, torn, or flattened. Replacement pads are available through Difsight Customer Support

HEALTH & HYGIENE TIPS

- Keep nesting boxes dry - moisture leads to bacteria.
- Ensure good ventilation in coop to prevent mold.
- Remove broken eggs immediately to prevent mess.
- Monitor hens for respiratory issues (dust sensitivity).
- Quarantine new pads if hens show allergic reactions.
- Maintain 1 nesting box per 3-4 hens minimum.

⚠ WARNING

If hens avoid the nesting box after pad installation:

- Check for strong odors.
- Ensure pad isn't too thick/uncomfortable.
- Verify dummy egg is secure (not rolling).
- Try introducing pad gradually.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS

Temperature

Safe for use in typical coop temperatures (32-85°F).

May deteriorate faster in extreme heat/humidity.

Keep dry in winter - wet pads can freeze.

Humidity

High humidity areas: Check for mold 2x per week.

Use moisture-absorbing bedding underneath if needed.

Increase ventilation to prevent dampness.

Seasonal Care

Spring/Summer - Watch for moisture and pests.

Fall/Winter - Ensure pads stay dry; check for freezing.

DO NOT USE IF

- ⊗ Pad shows signs of mold or mildew.
- ⊗ Jute fibers are heavily soiled or matted.
- ⊗ Material is torn or falling apart.
- ⊗ Pad has been contaminated with chemicals/pesticides.
- ⊗ There's an infestation of pests.
- ⊗ Pad remains wet after 48 hours of drying.
- ⊗ Strong ammonia smell is present.

Disposal

This product is made from natural materials.

Eco-friendly disposal options:

- Compost (cut into small pieces first).
- Use as garden mulch.
- Dispose in yard waste bin.
- Regular trash if contaminated.

DO NOT burn - creates fire hazard and air pollution.

FAQ / TROUBLESHOOTING

Q1. What should I do if a part is missing or damaged?

- Stop assembly and contact customer support. Include your, model number part name, and a photo if possible.

Q2. My hens are scratching and tearing the jute pads. Is this normal?

- Yes. Hens often scratch and peck at new nesting pads out of instinct. This may cause surface tears that temporarily interfere with egg rolling. The behavior typically stops after 2-3 pad replacements as the hens adapt to the pads and their surroundings.

Q3. Can I use straw or wood shavings instead of the jute pads?

- You can add a small amount of straw or wood shavings on top of the jute pad for extra comfort. However, do not add so much that it blocks eggs from rollin down the slope into the collection tray. The jute pads are specifically designed to let eggs roll while providing a soft nesting surface.
